

TILDEN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORSFriday, June 5, 2020
Workshop

The Tilden Township Board of Supervisors met in the Township Municipal Building with the following present: Supervisors Gene Schappell, Fred Herman; Chief William McEllroy, Road Master Mike Quick, Manager/Secretary/Treasurer Monica Flower, and local residents. Absent: Richard DeLong. The attendance roster is on file with the secretary.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Gene Schappell at 9:13 a.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

- There were no comments or questions

POLICE:

- Chief McEllroy gave a briefing on the protests being held and upcoming within the surround areas. Those protest already held were reported as peaceful events.
- An update on the Kernsville Dam/Rock are was reported.

ROAD MASTER:

- The 2020 Road Project started this week and will be finished today.
- Darryl will be off for a week due to surgery.
- Mowing the shoulders will begin on Monday (6/8).

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

- The re-opening of the parks, baseball field, pavilion rentals and movie nights were discussed as follows and will be added to the agenda for the regular meeting:
 - a. The Senator Rhoades park/basketball court to be re-opened.
 - b. The playground at the township to be re-opened. The play equipment will be sprayed down at least twice a week with date/time of cleaning recorded. Bathrooms to be re-opened and sanitized at least twice a week.
 - c. Baseball will be allowed to conduct practice only for the month of June with no more than 25 people in each group. Baseball staff will be responsible for cleaning/disinfecting the dugouts, bleachers and field. Concessions stand will remain closed
 - d. Pavilion & Concession stand rentals will resume. Concession stand and bathrooms will be cleaned/sanitized after every rental
 - e. Movie night will be tentatively scheduled for August 8th.

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- MS4 - Township has received 40 magnets promoting and educating on the importance of protecting our waterways. These are available to anyone at the township office. A discussion was held regarding permit requirements for this year.
- A discussion was held regarding the truck traffic on Diamond Drive and the placing of signs for weight restrictions or delivery only. This will be further discussed at the regular meeting with the Township Solicitor and Township Engineer.
- Adopt-A-Roadway: The Township will be sponsoring a one-day clean-up event at Hill Drive on June 16th from 10am - 2pm. That section of road will be temporarily closed by the police and roadcrew for participants safety. Water will be provided by the police department.
- The Zoning Hearing Board scheduled for June 25, 2020 for 22 Willow Road was discussed and will be on the regular meeting agenda for further discussion of the sign placement.
- The Secretary reported the following address changes/additions in the Township:
 - a. Property over behind the Westy's area known as Harry's Grove had an unrecognized address of 7 R Hill Rd which will now be 35 Oak Alley.
 - b. Property located on Mountain View Drive owned by Joe Tetz has an unrecognized address of 501 Mountain View Drive which will be readdressed to 525 Mountain View Drive.Property owners will be notified by mail and a copy of the addressing ordinance will be included.
- Items briefly mentioned and will be on the regular meeting agenda for discussion are the grease trap ordinance and the road occupancy ordinance.
- It was reported Walnut Acres has been dumping fill on their property approximately in the location of the proposed road to be developed. The Township Engineer will be directed to contact their engineer and/or property owners to cease operations.

A Motion was made by Fred Herman and seconded by Gene Schappell to adjourn the meeting at 11:08am. Upon roll call Schappell and Herman voted yes.
