Part 1

General Regulations

Section 101. Definitions and Interpretation.

(a) Words and phrases, used in this Chapter, except for sections or parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81), 75pa. C.S. Section 101, et seq., as amended, except that, in this Chapter, the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway", and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.

(b) In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

Section 102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations. All traffic and parking regulations shall be enacted in accordance with the laws and regulations of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987, Article 1, Section 2)

Section 103. Temporary and Emergency Regulations. The Chief of Police shall have the power to adopt and enforce any such temporary or experimental regulations as may be necessary to cover emergencies or special conditions. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987, Article 1, Section 3)

Section 104. Traffic on Highways Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance, or Special Events.

(a) The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to close any highway or any specific part of a highway to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion while construction or maintenance work is underway or a special event is being constructed on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.

(b) The Board of Supervisors shall have the authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any highway or construction where maintenance work is underway and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be

unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or signaling the vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

(c) Any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25) and costs.

Section 105. Authority of Police Officers. The police officers of the Township will have authority to direct traffic on the highways in the Township, at intersections in public and other places where the Vehicle Code or this Chapter applies. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987, Article 1, Section 5)

Part 2

Traffic Regulations

Section 201. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Highways.

(a) Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specific highways, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any part of a highway where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the highway:

(b) Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35) plus costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour (5 mph) shall pay an additional fine of Two Dollars (\$2) per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour (5 mph) over the maximum speed limit.

Section 202. Vehicle Weight Limits Established on Certain Streets and Bridges.

(a) On the following bridges and streets or parts of streets, by authority granted by Section 4902(a) of the Vehicle Code, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to drive any vehicle or combination having a gross weight in excess of the maximum prescribed below for that bridge or street or part of street, as the case may be, except in instances of bona fide local deliveries.

(1) Laurel Avenue	Entire Length	10,000 lbs.

(b) Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall be prosecuted under Section 4902(a) and 4902(g-1) of the Vehicle Code, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$150 plus \$150 for each 500 pounds, or part thereof, in excess of 3,000 pounds over the maximum allowable weight, and costs.

Section 203. Stop Intersections Established.

(a) The following intersections are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected, or are ratified if previously erected, in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first-named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall stop the vehicle as required by the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa. C.S. Section 3323(b), and shall not proceed into or across the second-named or intersecting or through street until he has followed all applicable requirements of that section of the Code.

Section 204. Right Turn Keep Moving Intersections Established.

(a) The following intersections are established as right turn keep moving intersections and official signs shall be erected, or are ratified if previously erected, in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first-named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, if turning right, shall not be required to stop the vehicle and shall proceed into the second-named or intersecting street.

(b) Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) and costs.

Section 205. Left Turns Prohibited.

(a) The following intersections are established as left turns prohibited intersections and official signs shall be erected, or are ratified if previously erected, in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first-named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall be prohibited from turning left and shall only be able to proceed right into the second-named or intersecting street.

Section 301. Parking, Stopping and Standing Prohibited at All Times in Certain Locations. Parking, stopping and standing shall be prohibited at all times in the following locations:

Section 302. "No Parking" Areas. No person shall park or leave unattended any vehicle of any kind at places designated by the Supervisors as "No Parking" areas, provided said areas are marked by the Supervisors by "No Parking" signs. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987; as amended by Ordinance No. 116, September 2, 1997, Section 1)

Section 303. Parking Prohibited in Certain Areas. No person shall park or leave unattended any vehicle of any kind in the following areas within the Township:

- (a) On a roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street (double parking);
- (b) on a sidewalk, except for pedalcycles;
- (c) within an intersection of a street;
- (d) on a crosswalk at an intersection of a street;
- (e) within fifteen feet (15') of a fire hydrant
- (f) within thirty feet (30') of any flashing signal, stop sign or yield sign or

traffic control signal located on any street;

(g) in front of a public or private driveway;

(h) on a two-way street with its right hand wheels more than twelve inches (12") from the curb in the direction of authorized traffic movement

Section 304. Handicapped Parking Areas.

(a) At the request of any handicapped person or severely disabled veteran, the Supervisors may cause to be erected on the highway as close as possible to their place of residence a sign or signs indicating that that place is reserved for the handicapped person or severely disabled veteran.

(b) No person shall park or leave any vehicle, except those vehicles lawfully bearing a handicapped plate or placard, in a posted handicapped space.

Section 305. Enforcement.

(a) Police Officers who are members of the Police Department of the Township or a Police Department engaged by the Township shall have the authority to affix upon any vehicle parked in violation of any provision of the law or of Sections 301 through 303, inclusive, of this Part a traffic tag giving notice of that violation and notifying the owner and operator of that illegally parked vehicle that if he or she shall pay the sum of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) at the office of the Township Municipal Building, 874 Hex Highway, Tilden Township, within seventy-two (72) hours from the time of the notice, such amount shall be deemed as and shall constitute the full penalty for that violation, and that if such payment shall not be made at the office of the Township Municipal Building within the seventy-two (72) hour period, that violator shall be subject to prosecution and to the penalty prescribed in Section 306 of this Part.

(b) Police Officers who are members of the Police Department of the Township or a Police Department engaged by the Township shall have the authority to affix upon any vehicle parked in violation of any provision of the law or of Section 304 of this Part a traffic tag giving notice of that violation and notifying the owner and operator of that illegally parked vehicle that if he or she shall pay the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) at the office of the Township Municipal

Building, 874 Hex Highway, Tilden Township, within seventy-two (72) hours from the time of the notice, such amount shall be deemed as and shall constitute the full penalty for that violation, and that if such payment shall not be made at the office of the Township Municipal Building within the seventy-two (72) hour period, that violator shall be subject to prosecution and to the penalty prescribed in Section 306 of this Part.

Section 306. Penalty for Violation.

(a) Any person who violates any provision of Sections 301 through 303, inclusive, of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and costs, and in default of payment of fine, to imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days.

(b) Any person who violates any provision of Section 304 of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) and costs, and in default of payment of fine, to imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days.

Section 307. Number, Gender. The word person used in this Chapter shall in all cases include any individual or individuals, partnership, association or corporation, singular or plural, including the responsible officers of any such association or corporation. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987; as amended by Ordinance No. 116, September 2, 1997, Section 1)

Part 4

Snow and Ice Emergency Regulations

Section 401. Definitions and Interpretations.

(a) Words and phrases, when used in this Part, except for sections or parts to which difference or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in The Vehicle Code (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81), as amended, except that in this Part, the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.

(b) In this Part, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular and the masculine shall include the feminine.

Section 402. Snow and Ice Emergency. In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the Township streets, in the event of a snow or ice storm that accumulates to one inch (1") or more (designated in this Part as a "snow emergency"), it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the snow emergency for any person to park a motor vehicle or to allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere on the cartway of any Township street; provided, however, that said prohibition shall not include parking on the shoulder of any Township street, so long as such shoulder is clearly delineated by painted striping, or parking on any area adjacent to the paved cartway of any Township street. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987; as amended by Ordinance No. 134, August 14, 2001, Section 1)

Section 403. Penalty for Violation. If at any time during a period of snow emergency pursuant to Section 402 of this Part a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked on any Township street, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) and costs. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987; as amended by Ordinance No. 134, August 14, 2001, Section 1)

PART 5

VEHICLE MAINTENANCE IN RIGHTS-OF-WAY

Section 501. No Major Vehicle Maintenance in Rights-of-Way. That in order to promote the safety of those using the Rights-of-Way of the Township the following conduct is prohibited:

To engage or cause another to engage in the performance of major vehicle maintenance upon any public rights-of-way within the Township. Major maintenance as defined herein includes any maintenance that cannot be or is not completed within a 24 hour period, unless circumstances not foreseeable at the time of beginning such maintenance and beyond control of the individual engaged in the maintenance or one causing another to engage in the maintenance prevent completion within 24 hours. Such prohibited major maintenance shall not be construed to include repairs necessary to repair an automobile in order to return the automobile to a safe operating condition if such repairs become necessary while the vehicle was traveling the public rights-of-way in the Township. Further, minor maintenance such as changing fluids, changing tires, adding fluids, and cleaning the vehicles, (excepting refinishing or painting of the exterior or reconditioning or cleaning engines) are specifically allowed if conducted in compliance with this and all other applicable laws and ordinances.

Section 502. Penalties for Violation. Any person, partnership, corporation or other entity who or which has violated or permitted the violation of the provisions of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof in an action brought before a District Justice in the same manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, be sentenced to pay a fine of at least One Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00) and not more than One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) and costs of prosecution and/or to undergo imprisonment to the extent permitted by law for the punishment of summary offenses. The Township Solicitor may assume charge of the prosecution without the consent of the District Attorney as required under Pa. R.C.P. No. 83(c) (relating to trial in summary cases). Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. (Ordinance No. 53, December 4, 1984, Section 2; as amended by Ordinance No. 173, March 4, 1997, Section 5)

PART 6

OBSTRUCTION OF STREETS

Section 601. Definitions.

(a) For purpose of this Part, the word "person" shall mean natural person, partnership, corporation, association or any other legal entity.

(b) Public Way shall mean any federal, state or Township street or road or right-of-way.

(Ordinance No. 104, December 1, 1994, Section 1)

Section 602. Prohibition of Obstruction. In order to keep any street, road, alley or other public way within the physical and/or corporate boundaries of the Township, both the traveled portion as well as any other portion free and clear of all obstructions and debris of any type or kind as set forth, this Part. It is hereby prohibited for any person to deposit, pump, throw, shovel, cast, plow and/or allow to migrate or filter onto any said public way, the following substances: ice, snow, manure, soil, manure mixed with soil, grass clippings, ash or any other debris or like substance, both natural and artificial, in such a manner, so as to hinder or interfere with the use of, block or obstruct the public way.

Section 603. Penalties for Violation. Any person, partnership, corporation or other entity who or which has violated or permitted the violation of the provisions of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof in an action brought before a District Justice in the same manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, be sentenced to pay a fine of at least One Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00) and not more than One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) and costs of prosecution and/or to undergo imprisonment to the extent permitted by law for the punishment of summary offenses. The Township Solicitor may assume charge of the prosecution without the consent of the District Attorney as required under Pa. R.C.P. No. 83(c) (relating to trial in summary cases). Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. (Ordinance No. 104, December 4, 1984, Section 3; as amended by Ordinance No. 113, March 4, 1997, Section 10)

Part 7

Interpretation and Appeal

Section 701. Severability. The provision of this Chapter shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or otherwise invalid, that decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Chapter. It is declared as a legislative intent that this Chapter would have been enacted had that unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid provision not been included in the Chapter. (Ordinance No. 63, December 17, 1987, Article 7, Section 1)

Section 702. Provision to be Continuation of Existing Regulations. The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.
