AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, LAYING OUT AND OPENING FOR PUBLIC USE AND TRAVEL, OAK ALLEY, EXTENDING FROM A POINT TEN FEET SOUTH OF THE SOUTH-WEST CORNER OF REAL ESTATE OWNED BY HERBERT RITTER AND JENNIE RITTER, EASTWARDLY TO THE WESTERN RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF THE PUBLIC TOWNSHIP ROAD KNOWN AS HILL ROAD, AND PLACING SAID OAK ALLEY ON THE TOPOGRAPHICAL SURVEY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN, BERKS COUNTY, PA.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Tilden, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION I - Oak Alley, extending from a point ten feet south of the southwest corner of real estate owned by Herbert Ritter and Jennie Ritter, eastwardly to the western right-of-way line of the public Township Road known as Hill Road, all in the Township of Tilden, Berks County, Pennsylvania, is hereby laid out and opened to public use and travel and placed upon the topographical survey of the Township of Tilden, being more particularly bounded and described as follows, to wit:

ALL THAT CERTAIN public alley located in the community of West Hamburg, Tilden Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania, known as Oak Alley, extending from a point ten feet south of the southwest corner of real estate owned by Herbert Ritter and Jennie Ritter (Deed Book Vol. 727 page 192, Berks County records), and bearing north seventy degrees forty three minutes East, a total distance measured along the center line of said alley of five hundred three and sixty seven hundredths feet (503.67') to the approximate western right-of-way line of the public Township road known as Hill Road, also shown on the map of Berks County prepared and edited by the Pennsylvania Department of Highway in cooperation with the Bureau of Public Roads, U.S. Department of Commerce, Copyright 1966, Bureau of Publications, Department of Property and Supplies, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, said alley to be twenty (20') feet wide throughout, measured at right angles southwardly from the average southern property line limits of the several tracts of privately-owned real estate adjacent to said alley, and northwardly to Main Street, also known as State Street, also known as Legislative Route #06040, Spur, as shown on the Map of Berks County prepared and edited by the Pennsylvania Department of Highways in cooperation with

the Bureau of Public Roads, U.S. Department of Commerce, Copyright 1966, Bureau of Publications, Department of Property and Supplies, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Having a lineal length of five hundred three and sixty-seven hundredths feet (503.67') and being in accordance with a Plan prepared by Elliot K. Ziegler, being Plan #758-405-Y-38, dated September, 1970, which Plan is attached hereto.

SECTION 2 - The Township Engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to take whatever steps are necessary to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3-- The Township Solicitor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to take whatever steps are necessary to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4 - All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.


