## ORDINANCE NO. 29,1970

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, LAYING OUT AND OPENING FOR PUBLIC USE AND TRAVEL, CEDAR ALLEY, EXTENDING FROM THE EASTERN RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF THE PUBLIC ROAD LEGISLATIVE ROUTE #06046 ALSO KNOWN AS MAPLE DRIVE, EASTWARDLY TO THE WESTERN RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF THE PUBLIC TOWNSHIP ROAD KNOWN AS DIAMOND DRIVE, AND PLACING SAID CEDAR ALLEY ON THE TOPOGRAPHICAL SURVEY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN, BERKS COUNTY, PA.

DE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Tilden, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as fol-

SECTION 1 - Cedar Alley, extending from the eastern right-of-way line of the public road, Legislative Route #06046 also known as Maple Drive, eastwardly to the western right-of-way line of the public Township road known as Diamond Drive, all in the Township of Tilden, Berks County, Pennsylvania, is hereby laid out and opened to public use and travel and placed upon the topographical survey of the Township of Tilden, said portion of Cedar Alley being more particularly bounded and described as follows, to wit:

ALL THAT CERTAIN public alley located in the community of West Hamburg, Tilden Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania, known as Cedar Alley, extending from the eastern right of way line of the public road, Legislative Route #06046, also known as Maple Drive, and eastwardly to the western right-of-way line of the public Township road known as Diamond Drive; said alley having a total length measured along the middle thereof of 588.09 feet and bearing North seventy degrees thirty minutes East, and to be twenty feet (20') in width measured at right angles across same from the south right-of-way thereof which is the average north property line of the several plots of privately owned real estate immediately adjacent to said alley and extending southwardly to Main Street, also known as Stato Street, also known as Legislative Route #06046 Spur, as shown on the map of Berks County prepared and edited by the Pennsylvania Department of Highways in cooperation with the Bureau of Public Roads, U.S.Department of Commerce, Copyright 1966, Bureau of

Publications, Department of Property and Supplies, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Having a lineal length of 588.09 ft. and being in accordance with a Plan prepared by Elliot K. Ziegler, being Plan #758-405-Y-38, dated September, 1970, which Plan is hereto attached.

SECTION 2  $\sim$  The Borough Engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to take whatever steps are necessary to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3- The Township Solicitor be and he is herebyauthorized and directed to take whatever steps are necessary to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4 - All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
