


Rain Date: Sunday, April 24, 2016

#### The Year in Review

2015 was again a busy and productive year in Tilden Township and for the Board of Supervisors. In addition to maintaining efficient operations of a routine nature quite a few noteworthy changes, special activities, improvements, and initiatives occurred.

There were several personnel moves. Officer Dennis Schwoyer retired in August and Officer Jose Quinones was hired on the recommendation of Chief McEllroy after a thorough selection process was conducted. An Assistant Roadmaster position was created to provide experienced backup leadership for our roads and maintenance operations. Russell Werley was appointed to the position on a part time as needed basis. Donna Bausher resigned from the Zoning Hearing Board because she was moving out of the township. Richard DeLong was appointed to complete the remainder of her term. There was also turnover on the Planning Commission, as the term of Anna Shollenberger expired and Thomas Hojnowski resigned. Christopher Forte and Joshua Breslin were appointed as their replacements. Anna continues to serve as Secretary to the Planning Commission. The many years of faithful and effective service given by those departing employees and appointees are sincerely appreciated. We also appreciate the willingness of the newcomers to serve our community.

A new four year collective bargaining agreement was negotiated with the Tilden Township Police Association. Both parties approached the deliberations in a cooperative and positive manner. This allowed us to reach a fair and equitable contract, which we believe will provide long term stability in the department. The assistance of our Solicitor, Joan London, was invaluable in assuring the document was unambiguous and met all legal requirements.

Enhancements for the enjoyment of our residents included construction of a pavilion at the Senator James Rhoades Park. Family friendly outdoor movie nights at the Tilden Park were introduced and very well-received. We thank Nester's Sanitation and Haus Automotive for sponsoring the movies last summer.

New equipment purchases included installation of upgraded security cameras in the police station and expansion of the security system to cover the entire township building and grounds. A preowned boom truck in very good condition was purchased for the road crew's use. This allows for greater versatility and safety in performing a variety of tasks and reduces the need to rent equipment or use outside contractors for these jobs. An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) unit is now available in the Township Building for quick response in the event of a life threatening cardiac emergency in the immediate area. In relation to the AED purchase the office staff, road crew, and Township Supervisors completed the American Heart Association course in cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and AED use.

A road exchange with PennDOT is in the works. We believe this is in the best interest of the township. PennDOT wants to take over approximately 2 miles of Old Route 22 at the west end of the township. In return the township will take Maple Drive, Berne Road from Bachmoll Road to the township line, and St. Michael's Church Road from Old Route 22 to Salem Church Road. The township will receive funds to make any necessary repairs to the roadways being accepted and we will be exchanging two bridges for one, which is in good condition. In other roadway news, widening of Pine Road to promote safer travel was approved, as this has become a major thoroughfare to our commercial district.

The Earth Day Cleanup Event was conducted successfully in conjunction with the Blue Mountain Wildlife organization. Over a ton of refuse was collected at the Kernsville Dam Recreation Area and from township roads, which filled a large roll off container. We are grateful for the assistance of township residents and Blue Mountain Wildlife volunteers in this endeavor. We also gratefully acknowledge the assistance provided by Nester's Sanitation in disposal of the materials collected, free of charge. Information about this year's cleanup is contained elsewhere in this newsletter and we encourage all residents to pitch in to help keep **your** township clean and attractive. Tilden Township also hosted a free shredding event for our residents sponsored by Representative Jerry Knowles and Senator Dave Argall.

Meetings commenced to address vandalism, illegal dumping, and public safety concerns at the Kernsville Dam Recreation Area. These included representatives of the PA Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), which administers the area; Blue Mountain Wildlife, Inc., which maintains the area; the PA Fish & Boat Commission; the PA State Police; the Tilden Township Police Department; Reading, Blue Mountain, & Northern Railroad; and the Tilden Township Board of Supervisors. At this time the process of establishing enforceable rules and regulations is still ongoing. Finally, a balanced budget of over \$1.87 million was adopted for 2016. This was done without any increase in the local property tax rate, with one exception. The West Hamburg Street Light Tax was raised for the first time in over 20 years, but only sufficient to cover increased expenses. The Board of Supervisors acknowledges the diligence and hard work that went into preparation of the budget proposal by the Township staff.

#### TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION'S REPORT

During the year 2015, the Commission reviewed the following land development plans:

- 1) Dr. Ashok Kumar submitted a preliminary/final plan to construct a proposed 8,000 sq. ft. ambulatory surgical center for specialty out-patient procedures with no overnight stays. The facility to be located along the west side of Industrial Drive.
- 2) Joseph Jurgielewicz had submitted a preliminary/final plan for Lots 5 & 6, a lot consolidation/combination, to construct a single family dwelling along Cheese Lane.

The Board of Supervisors appointed two new commission members, Joshua Breslin and Christopher Forte.

Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:30 P.M., in the Township Municipal Building. If a meeting is canceled due to the lack of agenda items or rescheduled, a notice will be posted on the township's website and on the door at the Municipal Building.

#### **Tilden Township Police Department**

In 2015, the department's three fulltime police officers handled just over 1000 calls. We saw the retirement of one officer and the hiring of another.

Scams - This was mentioned in the 2015 newsletter but I wanted to mention it again this year. Every year, police across the country seem to have more and more types of scams reported by residents. Tilden Township is no exception. Scams come in the form of phone calls, emails, text messages or good old fashion U.S. mail. Residents should be suspicious of anything that sounds "too good to be true." Scammers often call residents pretending to be businesses or government officials in order to coerce you into sending them money that you do not owe them. If you are not sure who is on the other end of that phone, do not provide them with any type of private information, especially financial. Get their name and phone number. Tell them you will call them back. Then do a little research using the Internet or a phone book. For instance, if someone calls claiming to be from your bank but something doesn't seem right, hang up and call your bank directly to be sure. A little due diligence goes a long way.

#### If you do become a victim of a scam, please report it right away by calling the police.

**Residential Numbering** - I am encouraging all residents of Tilden Township to mark their mailboxes with the number from their mailing address. If you previously marked your mailbox years ago but see that the numbers are either faded or missing, please replace them.

First responders such as police, fire and ambulance rely on these numbers to find your home in an emergency. Too often in rural areas, residences have little to no markings that indicate the number of the address. Seconds count in an emergency. By marking your mailbox or residence, you could very well be saving a life in the future.

## **Residents of Tilden Township**

IF YOU OR SOMEONE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD REQUIRES SPECIAL ASSISTANCE DURING AN EMERGENCY DUE TO A MEDICAL CONDITION, PLEASE COMPLETE THIS FORM AND RETURN IT TO THE OFFICE. **EVEN IF YOU HAVE**COMPLETED THIS FORM IN THE PAST, YOU NEED TO COMPLETE IT WITH YOUR INFORMATION AND SUBMIT IT AGAIN THIS YEAR.

In accordance with Public Law 1332, the Emergency Management Services Act, we are requesting certain information from Tilden Township residents. This law mandates that each municipality in Pennsylvania form a disaster emergency management plan to handle natural or man-made disasters. One aspect of the plan is to prepare for the needs of persons with special medical situations, those requiring transportation, non-English speaking persons, and residents with serious hearing impairments that will require special notification in case of emergency.

## Remember to get your permit!

<u>Driveway Permits</u> – Required for the construction of a new driveway, to reconstruct, improve, pave, or blacktop an existing driveway, and to construct and/or pave a drainage area or other means of ingress or egress to property which connects to a Township road. Application for a permit can be picked up at the Township office. The fee is \$50, payable at the time of application submission. Driveways abutting a state road require a permit from PennDOT. Please contact the Temple PennDOT office at 610-929-0766.

<u>Mobile Home Removal Permits</u> – Before removing a mobile home from the Township, all taxes must be paid in full and a removal permit must be obtained from the Tax Collector. Permit cost is \$2.

<u>Occupancy Permit</u> – Upon completion of a dwelling, an occupancy permit must be obtained from the Zoning Officer prior to establishing residence.

<u>On-Lot Sewage Permit</u> – State and Municipal laws require permits for the installation of any new on-site sewage system and corrections/repairs to any existing on-site system. To obtain a permit, contact the Sewage Enforcement Officer.

<u>Solicitation Permit</u> – Anyone engaged in selling, soliciting, or taking orders for any goods or merchandise will need a solicitation permit before sales commence. Permit fee is \$10. Charitable organizations are required to obtain a permit, but the \$10 fee is waived. Application can be picked up at the Township office and is subject to review by the Township Police prior to issuance.

<u>Zoning/Building Permits</u> – Required for new construction, additions to existing structures, garages, porches and/or decks, accessory buildings (sheds), swimming pools, roof replacement, retaining walls, fences, and accessory farm buildings. A zoning permit is also required for home occupations. If you are unsure of your permitting needs, **contact the Township office prior to beginning your project.**
